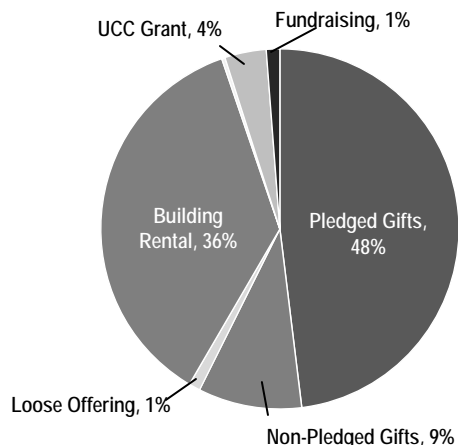

At our Annual Meeting in January this year, we voted that the mission of Broadview Community United Church of Christ was to share the Good News of Jesus Christ beyond our doors by:

- Welcoming diversity
- Pursuing social justice
- Supporting environmental responsibility
- Promoting peace
- And striving to seek common ground.

We are already a vibrant, diverse community, and this fall we are fulfilling some of the other goals by installing an environmentally friendly furnace, by assisting in the Food Lifeline program and by focusing on solutions to the homelessness problem in our neighborhood.

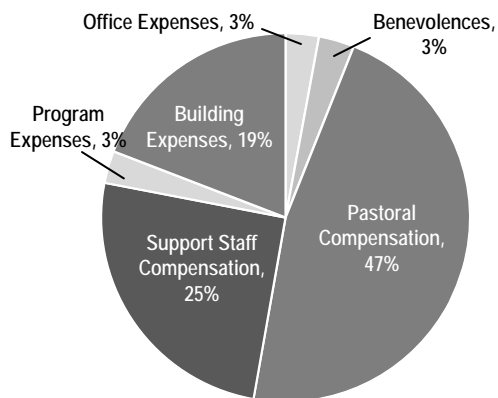
However, we face a major budget challenge at this time. The pie charts in the brochure show you our current income and expenses. The Rental Committee has increased rental contracts to the maximum possible. As you can see, there is no fat in this budget.

The bar graph explains the distribution of pledges for the past year. In 2014, 24 families and individuals pledged \$54,390.

Pastoral compensation in 2014 was about \$49,000 for a 3/4 time pastor and pulpit supply. Our pledges directly fund the pastor. **In order to call a new pastor, we need to increase pledges by at least \$8,000 in 2015.**

Our target 2015 Pledge Amount is \$63,000. This increase must come from us, the members and friends of BCUCC.

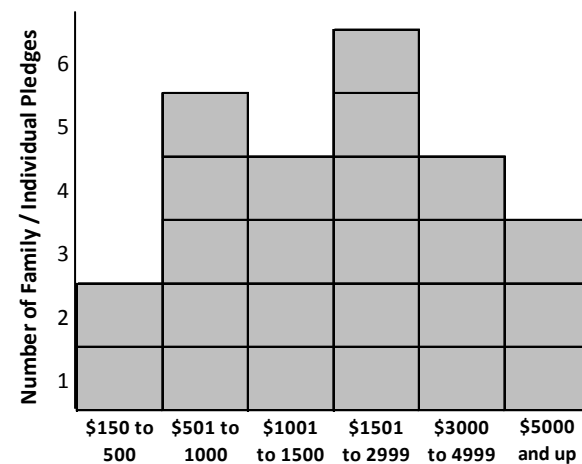
